


## 3.7 Submitting a Draft

**3.7.1:** Once you are satisfied with your draft, it is time to submit your work. Click [Submit Draft] below the work. This is the version of your work that will be sent to others for review.

- Until the first person has begun to look at your work to submit feedback, you will see an [Unsubmit] button on the submitted version. You can still make changes.
- As soon as the first person has begun to look at your work, you cannot make any further changes to the version reviewers will see. You can, however, continue to work on the current version.
